CHATEAU GODEAU.

As part of the consultancy mission of *SARL Derenoncourt Consultant* carried out by the œnologist Julien Lavenu, for Château Godeau and Château Godeau-Ducarpe, here are the tasting comments for the wines produced in 2014 before the bottling took place.

Tasting dated 24th May 2016:

Château Godeau-Ducarpe: a good general appearance. The colour is dark and clear, aromas of stone fruit and tangy fruit come largely to the fore on the nose. Tender on the palate and quite lean, medium-bodied with some energy, followed by a slightly quinine finish.

Les Escapades de Godeau: a deep, dark purple colour and a sombre, intense nose with ripe fruit. The wine is massive on the palate with broad shoulders. The oak ageing is in evidence and is well integrated. The finish is lively and precise. A wine with character.

Château Godeau: a very deep colour with a classy nose, characteristic of the place where the wine is produced. Oriental spices come through with black fruit aromas and hints of rare-cooked roasted meat juice. Powerful and rich on the palate, the wine has kept its youthful spirit. This is a dense, complex and vigorous wine which will be able to relax once in bottle.
